

Introducing...Lorna Ferguson



If you're new to Holyrood, you might not have heard of Lorna. She's one of the missionaries that we support as a church family. Lorna serves in Japan with OMF and is on the Leadership Team there. She attended Holyrood as a student and then while working in Edinburgh. She left to go to Japan with her husband, David, in 1998. They have four sons – Daniel (working in Bangkok), Matthew (working in Edinburgh), Calum (studying in the US) and Alistair (studying in Japan). David died of cancer in 2017 and Lorna continues to work in Japan. Here is an insight Lorna shared on Facebook on Saturday –

'Today (29th October) is a thought-provoking day:

- It would have been David's 58th birthday. I find myself wondering what his "58" would be like but of course that's unknowable since he's "forever 52". I do suspect though that he would still have his crazy sense of humour as in the photo below!
- 30 years ago today we arrived in Thailand for a holiday that would change the trajectory of our lives. Through meeting various people whilst we were here, especially a couple church planting in Phuket, God started to call us into mission too. It feels strange being in Bangkok again exactly 30 years to the day, though it wasn't planned that way.
- In a few days it will be 10 years since David and I took over the Field Director role in Japan. OMF has a 10 year limit on field leadership appointments so we would have been stepping down around now. What would we have been moving on to? Back to church planting? Of course this is unknowable too because my trajectory changed again when David died (I have another 2+ years in my current role).



Unknowables and changed trajectories, but what I do know is God is in control, working through all things and that He still has things for me to do, even though I may not know them. So trusting Him today and with my future.'

Lorna is planning to be back in Scotland from mid-December until mid-February. We're looking forward to having her in Holyrood for a couple of Sundays when she's back and you can meet her in person.

Book Review – Together Through the Storm by Sally Sims

Has Pastoral Care month left you thinking, questioning and wondering what it means for you? This book by Sally Sims can help. The author works as a pastoral care coordinator in a church in Australia and comes from a nursing background. Her wisdom and wide experience makes this a very practical book for each of us. It is easy to read (although challenging) and is in three main parts —

- Suffering and the God who cares
- Biblical foundations for Christian care
- Christian care in action



The focus is on Christ centred care and what this looks like from a biblical point of view in relation to difficult situations and how care can be practically expressed. But it is also very down to earth in showing the simple everyday things we can do to care for each other. There are useful insights on every page.

I have read the book several times now and it has helped me to be more intentional in caring. I will keep going back to it again and again when I need to refocus. I hope you will find it helpful too. There is a copy in the church library.

Please be praying as plans are finalised and we get together on the 5^{th} - Norma Shippin will be


our speaker. We'll also have an interview, book review, time to pray and our breakfast together 😉
