# **Reflection: Christmas Appeal 2022**

Our Christmas Appeal is under way and I want to connect the mission of Holyrood with two of the organisations that we are partnering with. Next week I'll say something about the other two.

#### The Bonar Trust

A YouGov survey completed earlier this year indicated that only 1 in 3 Scots identify as Christian. Of this group, only 28% professed to believe 'that Jesus was a real person who died and came back to life and was the Son of God'. This means that less than 1 in 10 Scots right now can be identified as Christian in any meaningful sense. No wonder we increasingly hear Scotland being described as a mission field.

Where does the re-evangelisation of Scotland begin? In truth, there is no one action to pinpoint. However, vital to the cause is training up as many gospel workers as possible to go out into the villages, towns, and cities of Scotland in order to plant new churches, revitalise old ones, and to engage in other forms of pioneering mission work.

The mission of the Bonar Trust is to help support and train up gospel workers so that men and women will be prepared for the ministry needs of today's church. The trust has already had a significant impact in terms of opening up a bigger pipeline of ministry trainees. Yet, the true importance of the trust is not only that it is increasing the number of workers, but that it is also improving the quality of workers being sent out. You may have noticed a number of high calibre preachers – often still in their mid to late 20s – filling pulpits in recent years. This is no accident. The apprenticeship model supported by the Bonar Trust has helped to make sure that academic seminary education is balanced by practical experience and on the ground training in local churches.

It's a joy and privilege to be able to contribute something this year to the great mission of re-evangelising Scotland.

### Our 'Missionary Partners' in North Africa

Revelation 7:9 says,

'After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!'

There are so many wonderful truths jam packed in this verse. However, I want to draw special attention to the simple adjective 'all'. Revelation says that the multitude before the throne will include people of *all* nations. This amazing truth ought to inspire us as we think of countries where people are trapped in the darkness of Islam, secularism, or other false religions. The hope of the gospel is nothing less than that there will be representatives of every tribe, tongue, and nation joining in the great choir of worshippers in the city of God.

Over the last year we have been getting to know a missionary family working in one of the darkest parts of North Africa. We have faithfully been praying for them. This Christmas we have the opportunity to encourage their hearts, not just with prayers, but with a financial gift. Let's think of our gift as a way of sending a smile and a hug across the globe. All of us live on a frontline of evangelism. Yet, some frontlines are more difficult to hold than others. Let's give thanks for the privilege of being able to express love and support to a family who are pouring themselves out as a drink offering on behalf of a unreached people group.


