# New Member - Fiona MacMillan

On Sunday, Fiona was welcomed into membership of the Holyrood church family. Here's her story so far -

'Hello. I'm Fiona. I'm married to Neil, have two sons, a daughter and four grandchildren.



Originally from "The Blue Toon" in Aberdeenshire, I've lived in Edinburgh for the past 41 years. For the last 10 years I worked part-time as an administrator, but "retired" last year so that I could spend more time with, and help, my father and family.

My faith journey is no road to Damascus experience. Growing up among seafarers and farming folk, belief and trust in God was in my DNA from birth, but undoubtedly nurtured by living in a Christian home: I can never hear the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm sung to the tune Crimond without being transported to my maternal grandparent's farm in the parish of Crimond where family gatherings always finished with the singing of that praise. As a teenager, I made a public declaration of faith and joined the Church of Scotland and, on moving to Edinburgh, I moved "my lines" to the local church where I participated fully in all aspects of the fellowship.

Due to family commitments, a few months pre Covid, I withdrew from the church I was attending and became an "itinerant worshipper", selfishly benefiting from encouraging teaching and preaching without engaging in, or committing to, the activities and work of any particular church. During this period, I occasionally popped in to Holyrood where, whether during Phil Hair's ministry or the unsettling time of vacancy, I genuinely always felt at home and came away having been challenged and uplifted by the preaching. Covid, and the attendant lockdowns, changed our lives in all manner of ways, but it was great to be able to find strength and encouragement through hearing God's word faithfully preached via the internet. As public spaces gradually began to open up, I once again felt God directing me to "in person" worship at Holyrood.

Some of you I've known for some time; from Norma Downie's Bible Study days in the mission hall in Britwell Crescent, or from the school walk with our respective children. Others I recognise from past shared activities between our former churches. More recently I've got to know folk thanks to the Ladies Breakfasts, attending the Toddler Group with one of my grandsons, and even when visiting the housing complex where my father now lives!

Change is unsettling and challenging, but I know that God has led me to the fellowship here at Holyrood and, holding fast to the promise of Proverbs 3:5-6, I'm looking forward to growing my faith, serving Christ and getting to know more of you.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

## **Update from Fiona and Ken**

On Thursday last we met with the consultant who confirmed a diagnosis of myeloma and discussed two lines of treatment available. Fiona has decided to go for the intensive treatment, which is two hospital visits a week in four week blocks over four months. Towards the end of the four there is the possibility of stem cell treatment, depending on effective response to the treatment received - which would involve three weeks in hospital. While this sounds a bit daunting the consultant is confident Fiona can cope with the treatment and side effects. Already she has benefited from a reduction in pain due to medication which has been great.

We both have felt a sense of peace about this, thanks to your prayers and wonderful care and concern and a loving Heavenly Father, who has sustained and accompanied us on this journey through the valley.

Due to Fiona having an extremely low immune system we both need to remain free from any infections which may hinder the treatment, so we are unlikely to be able to attend church meetings. Visitors will also be an issue and it will be difficult having limited access to our families and grandchildren. At present with family and a few close friends we are coping with things, however should we require help in the days ahead we will have no hesitation in asking you. Your prayers and support mean so much to us at this time. If you wish to contact Fiona, please text or email and she can reply appropriately when she has time.

To the Elders and Members of HEC


