Reflection - Navigating Gospel Truth

"When it comes to reading the Gospel accounts of Jesus's life, we're faced with an exhilarating ride and an utterly breathtaking view. But to navigate the Gospels well, we need to get a sense of what the Gospels are, we need to find our feet, and we need to get a grasp of the terrain."

These are some words from the introduction to Rebecca McLaughlin's study guide which we are using in the weekly women's bible study sessions on a Thursday morning at 10.30am in the church hall.

I well remember coming to Holyrood as a student in 1977 (a lifetime ago) and being so excited by the fact that I had found a church where the word of God was central to everything and where I could drink deeply from a fountain of biblical truth week by week. It was never a sterile exercise — there was a real sense of being ushered into the presence of the living God and to come away feeling that we had met with the Lord Jesus. One of the things which I have treasured over the years is the joy and privilege of being able to learn so much from the many Godly men and women in the church. That excitement has never diminished and it remains such a blessing to be part of the body of Christ together. My thirst to learn more and to spend time with other believers is, I am sure, shared by all of us.



So, in these studies we are a group of women setting out to ask ourselves some searching questions and the purpose of doing this is to help us be confident that in the Gospel accounts we are getting access to what Jesus really did and taught. These questions are designed to help us understand that all four accounts were written well within the lifetime of the eyewitnesses to Jesus' life and that they record authentic testimony about historical events.

We have already looked at the authors of the Gospels and we will be going on to consider some other eye witness accounts of the

events; the differences in accounts between the Gospels and how they show different perspectives; the languages and texts used in the Gospels.

We long to meet with Jesus in these sessions and share thoughts and insights – to dig deeper into familiar stories and texts and learn from each other in that process. Beyond that we long to become more confident in our understanding of the Gospel story and to glory in the fact that Jesus really is the son of God who took

on human flesh and died to free us from our sin and shame and rise again to everlasting life. What could be a better way to spend our time? Come and join us!
