She had a team around her who worked like a well oiled machine – nothing was too much trouble for her – and we are sure many can testify to the excellent events which she masterminded in the church hall.

Kathleen was a long serving and faithful team member at the Wednesday Centre which provided care for a number of elderly and vulnerable folk. As well as being dependably faithful in attendance at services of worship and the prayer meeting, she served the church in a myriad of other ways. We remember many happy trips to Word Alive with Kathleen and her great friend Mary Philip (and one with Fiona Colville) which she really enjoyed and where it was a joy to worship together!

Although latterly Kathleen experienced some times of indifferent health, she was never one for self pity and she remained courageous and calm to the very end. An absolute example of meeting death with a steady eye. We look forward to that great, glad glorious day, when the dawn will break and the shadows flee away and we will meet again.
