Small Changes in How We Celebrate the Lord's Supper

Actions often silently (and unintentionally) communicate a message. Traditionally, when we celebrate communion, the elders have partaken of the elements first and then distributed them to the congregation. The fear of the session is that this order might communicate an unhelpful message to new people - as if the elders partake first because somehow they are more important than others. Our desire is that the opposite message is communicated, namely, that elders lead by service and put themselves last, not first.

Mindful of this, we are going to make a small change in how we celebrate the sacrament. This Sunday and from now on, the elders are going to wait to come onto the platform until after the minister has given thanks for the elements. They will then serve the congregation first before partaking of the elements themselves. Our hope is that these small adjustments will help to reinforce the teaching of Jesus that "whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10 v45).

We're looking forward to meeting in person **this Wednesday** at 7pm for our prayer meeting (refreshments served from 6.45pm). There is an online option and Zoom codes will be sent out on Wednesday morning.

We'll then head out to the park for a picnic (bring your own) and games. Everyone is welcome for the entire morning or just for the picnic.


Praying for Tranent
