Hello, my name is Matthew, and I am studying a Biomedical Sciences degree at the University of Edinburgh. I have recently moved into the Abbeyhill area, and I've been worshiping at Holyrood Evangelical for the last month or so.

I was raised by Christian parents who faithfully taught me the gospel, brought me to church, and set an example for me by their way of life. I do not remember a day when I did not believe Jesus Christ to be Lord. I professed faith at a young age, and tried to live as I thought a Christian should, however, my conscience was, even in primary school, afflicted with feelings of shame. I knew that there were things that I had done which were wrong, and that I was guilty in the sight of God and needed his forgiveness (though I may not have described my situation using these words). I knew that Jesus had died for me but, looking back now, I

don't think I had a particularly good grasp of what that really meant.

Over the years, God has slowly been teaching me more of His everlasting love for me in the cross - that Jesus came to die the death that I should have died for all the rebellious things I have done (and will do), exhausting His wrath so that I will never have to bear it. Now, through faith in Jesus, I enjoy peace with God, and know that, because the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead now dwells in me, I will one day rise too and enjoy friendship with God forever.
