Letter from Phil & Lyn Hair - 10th Anniversary Celebration

We're so very sorry that we can't be with you on this special occasion as you celebrate the tenth anniversary of Holyrood Evangelical Church. It would have been wonderful to join with you in worship and then in fellowship as you eat together, however a prior preaching engagement in our own church here in Stirling means that this can't be so.

How good God has been to you as a Fellowship over these past ten years since the decision was taken to leave the Church of Scotland, at not a little cost, and begin life as Holyrood Evangelical Church, meeting first of all in Leith Academy and Portobello Town Hall (my abiding memory is of how grubby the school could be and of how cold the town hall could be – and yet these were special times as God met with us and blessed us in ways too numerous to count)- and then in the building where you now are in Montgomery Street. How faithful God has been to you, not least in the provision of this home and place of worship. You were able to prove that 'God is no man's debtor' as the building was paid for in a such a relatively short time along with all the additional finance which meant that it could be upgraded and decorated.

As I've reflected on these years following the departure from the Church of Scotland, and the leaving (the loss of) the Holyrood Abbey building in London Road, there were two passages of Scripture which were comfortingly and reassuringly special to me. The first in Matthew 16, and Jesus words to his disciples – "I will build my church, and the gates of hell will not overcome it." I quoted these words at the Edinburgh Presbytery when I resigned my status as a Church of Scotland minister, saying that 'Jesus didn't promise to perpetuate a denomination, but to build his church.' The second in Revelation 4 and 5 which I expounded at our last evening service in Holyrood Abbey, underlining that no matter what, God is still on throne and is advancing his plans and purposes for the church in a hostile world. I quoted the words of the chorus...

'God is still on the throne and he will remember his own! Though trials upset you and burdens distress you, he will never leave you alone. God is still on the throne, and he will remember his own; his promise is true – he will not forget you! God is still on the throne.'

And then, the words of the hymn...

'Peace, perfect peace, our future all unknown? Jesus, we know, and he is on the throne.' This is still the case ten years later – and how we rejoice to see the way in which, since we left you some five years ago now, God has prospered and blessed you under Joe's leadership and ministry. And he will continue to do so because he is your faithful, good, wise and loving Shepherd. Jesus said (Luke 12 and verse 32) – "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom" – and may you see this, ever increasingly, in the days ahead.
