From the moment we walked through the door, it felt like we were coming home - and indeed we were, for in profound ways, Holyrood has always been our spiritual home. And though the building is less familiar to us (though not to our mother, who was so thrilled when it was purchased) the reality of the church just felt the same as it was decades ago when we grew up there. The singing was as we remember Holyrood singing to be - simply the best. And the sense of the presence of the Lord among his people was palpable - which helped me greatly, in an assignment which I knew would be hard, but one I wanted very much to be able to carry through. All in all it was a hard day for us all, but one of great blessing.

#### **Cornhill Bible Course**

A brand new **Cornhill Bible Course** launches in **January 2025!** This is a fantastic opportunity to learn about God's word. It is designed for those who are keen to develop in the joy of studying



and teaching the bible, but who cannot (yet!) commit to doing the full Cornhill Training Course. The course is delivered by Cornhill Scotland lecturers and runs on Saturday mornings from 08:00 to 09:15 (GMT) for six weeks on Zoom.

The first module will focus on the Gospels, particularly Mark and Luke.

- 11th, 18th, 25th January 2025 Mark with Andy Gemmill
- 1st, 8th & 15th February 2025 Luke with Jon Gemmell

#### The course will:

- ask what a gospel is and investigate the focus and form of Mark & Luke in particular
- give an understanding of the authorial purpose within each gospel
- take a specific look at individual passages and sections to give a flavour of the whole.

You are welcome to join the course from anywhere in Scotland, the UK or the world. The cost is £30. There are no pre-requisites – just an internet connection and a desire to take the bible seriously and learn from it. To join the course please register <a href="here.">here.</a>
