New Members – John and Margaret Pickering

We are delighted to be warmly welcomed into fellowship with you all in HEC and to make it our spiritual home.

I, (John) was brought up in a Christian home and am deeply indebted to my parents for their teaching, example and testimony (Dad, a Crusader leader and lay-preacher). Mum's father was Rev John Rigley, the Baptist Minister in Stirling (1938-1956) who made a profound and lasting impression on me. My second birthday (age 12 years) was one Sunday morning on 4th October 1959. Returning home after the morning service, while talking to Dad, without any forewarning, the Holy Spirit suddenly shone a light into my heart and mind and in response I instantaneously yielded to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Attendance at High Barnet Baptist Church in my late teens where Rev George Lazenby was the Minister, introduced me to expository preaching.

I, (Margaret) didn't come from a Christian background. At the age of 15 years I moved to Stirling High School from Turriff Academy in Aberdeenshire. For the two years I was there I was befriended by some of the Scripture Union Group members who occasionally took me to a Saturday evening club. I left school to study in Aberdeen where for most of my first year I didn't attend anything Christian, until in June I answered the phone to an unknown old lady who, with great forthrightness, asked whether I was a Christian! This challenging and uninvited intrusion ultimately led me to becoming a Christian! In my next three years I got

involved in Christian Union activities and enjoyed worshipping in Gilcomston South Church where Rev William Still was an excellent Bible teacher and pastor to a young Christian. His ministry has laid the foundation for my Christian life.

John and Margaret met each other in 1977 while running a children's Holiday Club in the Cornton area of Stirling and became an 'item' in 1978! We have two offspring - Gilly who you know, and Thomas, married to Claire with our two grandsons Sam and Joe.

The daily challenge of our Christian lives is to live out what we believe and profess. For us, discipleship is a matter of daily consecration and surrender, not a status based on a decision made yesterday. In particular, discipleship means showing the evidence of God's work of grace by his Spirit bearing the fruit(s) of sanctification and



increasingly to realise and enjoy the presence of the Risen Lord Jesus and appreciate the blessings and benefits and privilege and wonder of knowing God as our loving Heavenly Father. But also, there are the challenges to see and use opportunities for service and witness and ...to persevere to the end!
