A Week of Growth in Keswick

This May, I had the privilege of attending the Keswick Leadership Course, developed by Keswick Ministries and Forge Leadership Consultancy. Set in the beautiful Lake District—with sunshine and hardly a drop of rain—it was the perfect backdrop for a week of spiritual growth, leadership training, and deep reflection.

The course brought together 24 participants: pastors, church staff, nonprofit leaders, and others like me—wanting to grow and better serve Christ. We began each day with prayer,



worship, and powerful Bible teaching. These messages centred on four themes: **Identity in Christ, Integrity, Inner Strength, and Influence.**

We spent one hour each day in small breakout groups with a coach, where we shared what we'd accomplished in our homework assignments. This included work around life purpose, core values, goals, and an action plan. Each session ended in prayer—personal, heartfelt, & Spirit-led.

It was a moving, impactful experience. I left inspired to live more courageously in my faith and lead with greater clarity and purpose. Keswick Ministries takes just 24 delegates each May—and I highly recommend it to anyone seeking to grow in their calling!

Our church AGM and prayer meeting will take place this **Wednesday at 7pm**. Please attend if you're able and refreshments will be served from 6.45pm.


